Award #	Title	Description
322	Frederick Armand MCDIARMID Scholarship	A \$250 scholarship, a memorial to Frederick Armand McDiarmid, has been endowed by Neil H. McDiarmid. It is awarded to a student, graduate or undergraduate, with preference to those in Mining. Selection is based on academic standing, practical ability and experience, and promise in research.
2120	DUNSMUIR Scholarship	A scholarship of \$400, founded by the Hon. James Dunsmuir, is awarded to the undergraduate student entering third year in the Faculty of Applied Science with the highest standing in Mining and Mineral Process Engineering.
2176	Lt. Eric Soulis DITMARS Memorial Scholarship	A scholarship of \$1,150 has been endowed by the late William C. Ditmars. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Mining and Mineral Process Engineering to a student in the Department who shows promise of outstanding ability and has sound personal qualities and character.
2195	Fluor Canada Ltd. Award in Mining Engineering	An award of \$1,750 is offered annually by Fluor Canada Ltd., to a student entering their 3rd or 4th year of a program concentrating on Mineral Process Engineering. Preference will be given to a student entering 4th year. Candidates must have achieved at least a B average in their previous year of study and have demonstrated leadership and initiative through organization of and/or participation in campus and community activities. The award is made on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Mining Engineering.
2199	LORNEX Mining Corporation - Dr. E. B. Gillanders Memorial Scholarship	A scholarship of \$150 has been endowed by Lornex Mining Corporation Ltd. in memory of Dr. Earl B. Gillanders, B.A. (Geology) 1925, M.A. (1926), Ph.D. Princeton (1930) and his many contributions to the mining industry. The award is made to a student proceeding to a B.A.Sc. degree or higher degree in Mining and Mineral Process Engineering. The student must be planning to work in the mining industry following graduation. This award is made on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Mining and Mineral Process Engineering.
2247	Harold A. STEANE Memorial Award	A \$5,000 award is offered by the Harold A Steane Memorial Fund, in memory of Harold A. Steane, to a student entering either of the last two years of the mineral process undergraduate program. Preference is given to a student with demonstrated dedication to the mineral industry and the ability in working with others. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Mining Engineering.
4807	RIO Algom Scholarship	A scholarship of \$1400 has been endowed by Rio Algom Explorations Inc. and the Province of British Columbia. The scholarship will alternate between the Faculty of Applied Science and the Faculty of Science beginning in 1994/95 with the Faculty of Applied Science. The award is offered to a student in second year with a program concentration in Mining and Mineral Process Engineering and alternately, to a second year student with a program concentration in Geological Sciences. The award is made on the recommendation of the appropriate Faculty.
5307	Bernard BOE Memorial Scholarship	Scholarships totalling \$4550 have been endowed through the estate of Phyllis Elizabeth Duncan in memory of Bernard Boe for undergraduate students entering their final year of study in Geological Engineering or Mining Engineering. The awards are made on the recommendation of the eligible departments with the half total amount going to a student in Geological Engineering and half the amount to a student in Mining Engineering.
5314	SAG Mining Engineering Scholarship	Scholarships totalling \$1100 have been endowed by SAG for Mining Engineering students entering second year. The awards are made on the recommendation of the Department of Mining Engineering.
5318	Sandy LAIRD Service Award in Mining Engineering	Two awards of \$2,200 each have been made available through an endowment established by Sandy Laird, B.A.Sc., 1957 (Mining Engineer) to second year undergraduate students majoring in Mining Engineering in the Faculty of Applied Science. This award was originally conceived to inspire first year engineering students to pursue a career in mining engineering leading to operations management. Recipients have the opportunity to expand their understanding and knowledge of the industry that will help them succeed in their professional career. Strong leadership abilities are critical to advancement in the mining industry; therefore, candidates must have demonstrated leadership through active participation in extracurricular activities in high school, the community, the university and/or sports. The awards are made on the recommendation of the Department of Mining Engineering.
5335	Louis J. GALL Award in Mining Engineering	Service awards totaling \$10,950 have been endowed by Louis J. Gall (B.A.Sc. 1944) for students with satisfactory academic standing in the Department of Mining Engineering who have demonstrated leadership skills through participation in campus and community activities. The awards are made on the recommendation of the Department.

5373	James MARLOW Scholarship in Mining Engineering	Scholarships totalling \$11,750 have been endowed by the Estate of James Marlow for undergraduate students entering the fourth-year of mining engineering who demonstrate an interest in the design and operation of surface and/or underground mines. Recommendations are made by the Faculty of Applied Science.
5378	CONETEC Geotechnical Award in Engineering	Three service awards of \$2,500 each are offered by the Conetec Education Foundation to undergraduate students in second or third year who have demonstrated leadership, curiosity and independent thinking and who have indicated a desire and suitability to pursue field work and field research. Applicants from Civil Engineering, Geotechnical, Geological and Mining Engineering will be selected annually. Recipients may also be invited to apply for paid summer internship experience for a period of 12 - 16 weeks at one of ConeTec's North American field operations. The awards are made on the recommendation of faculty within the departments of Civil, Geotechnical Geological and Mining Engineering in the Faculty of Applied Science.
7680	IODE, Ruskin Chapter, Alfred Newton Wolverton Memorial Scholarship	A scholarship of \$1050, endowed by the Ruskin Chapter of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire through a bequest from Alfred Newton Wolverton, is offered to worthy and deserving undergraduates in Mining Engineering. Preference is given first, to students entering the third year, and second, to those proceeding from third to the final year. Scholarships are made on the basis of scholastic ability, promise in the field of mining, and financial need.
572	Charles and Jane BANKS Scholarship	This scholarship was established from a bequest to the University by the late Honourable Charles A. Banks who, during his term as Lieutenant Governor of the Province, was official Visitor of this University. This contribution, which provides support for worthy and deserving students is striking evidence of his generosity and that of his wife, and their concern for the welfare of others. Scholarships to a total of \$53,400 are awarded on the recommendation of the Faculties, to students who have completed at least one year in the following Faculties, and are continuing in the Faculty in an undergraduate program: Science (\$16,000), Applied Science (Engineering) (\$26,200), Forestry (\$2,700), Land and Food Systems (\$5,300) and Pharmaceutical Sciences (\$3,200). The Charles A. and Jane C.A. Banks Foundation was established by a bequest by the Honourable Charles A. Banks, who during his term as Lieutenant Governor of the Province was the Official Visitor of this University.
2139	MacKenzie SWAN Memorial Scholarship	Scholarships totalling \$4300 are awarded to students registered in the second, third or fourth year of the Faculty of Applied Science requesting financial assistance to enable them to continue studies at the University. The award was the gift of the late Colonel W. G. Swan and was made in memory of Catherin MacKenzie Swan, who passed away in December 1961, and their son, William MacKenzie Swan, an outstanding all-round undergraduate student and popular athlete, who died July 28, 1937 as a result of injuries received in a fall from the Pattullo Bridge in New Westminster, on which he was engaged as an Assistant Engineer. In making the awards, consideration will be given to the academic record of the applicants and to their participation in undergraduate affairs.
2226	Thomas BEECHING Scholarship	Scholarships totalling \$9,700 have been endowed by the late Thomas Arthur Beeching. The awards are made to engineering students on the recommendation of the Faculty of Applied Science.
5379	Faculty of Applied Science INTERNATIONAL student Scholarship	Scholarships of amounts of up to \$10,000 each are offered to continuing international students in the Faculty of Applied Science, Vancouver campus. Students selected for these scholarships must have completed at least 30 credits towards their undergraduate degree or be entering the second year of their program. Students must demonstrate strong academic achievement, engagement in the Faculty, and the potential to make a scholarly contribution within their chosen field of study. The scholarships are made on the recommendation of the Faculty of Applied Science.
5379	Faculty of Applied Science INTERNATIONAL student Scholarship	Scholarships of amounts of up to \$10,000 each are offered to continuing international students in the Faculty of Applied Science, Vancouver campus. Students selected for these scholarships must have completed at least 30 credits towards their undergraduate degree or be entering the second year of their program. Students must demonstrate strong academic achievement, engagement in the Faculty, and the potential to make a scholarly contribution within their chosen field of study. The scholarships are made on the recommendation of the Faculty of Applied Science.

7957	Cy and Emerald KEYES Bursary in Mining Engineering	Bursaries to a total of \$2,500 have been made available by the late Cy and Emerald Keyes for students in Mining Engineering. The awards are made on the recommendation of the Department of Mining Engineering. The bursaries are available only to Canadian citizens and permanent residents.
5368	Hexagon Award in Mining Engineering	Awards totalling \$5,000 are offered by Hexagon Mining. to undergraduate students enrolled in Mining Engineering. Preference will be given to students who have expressed interest in computer technology related to the mining industry. To be considered, candidates must show high academic achievement. The award is made on the recommendation of the Norman B Keevil Institute of Mining Engineering.
